As my predecessor, Gerald of Leesville used to say, we've got lots of stuff. Kemma and I have been trying to get a handle on what stuff we have, what it all is, what is still good and what should be junked. Toward that end, I have made up some lists of items that we could use some help on from the populace.

Mystery Items:

- ? Several yellow poles with black, spiral striping, in a sack. *What are these for?*
- ? Black fiberglass archery bow. *Who might this belong to, and why do we have it? Is it loaner gear?*
- ? Cardboard box full of what appears to be fish tank gravel.
- ? A sack of marble chippings
- ? Several unidentified pieces of wood stacked against the wall. *Anyone know what these might be for?*
- ? Planks marked "shelves", also stacked against the wall. *What are these shelves for, and how are they put together?*
- ? Several sets of tent poles for pavilions. *Need to identify which poles go with which tent.*

How to Wear a Traditional Sari

The traditional sari, a costume worn by Indian women, is simply a 5- to 9-m-long piece of cloth folded and tucked to form a graceful, sweeping skirt and “scarf” hung over the shoulder.

There are other ways to wear a sari, but this is a common one. For other examples, see Wikipedia for an overview and Web pages and books for specific directions.

You will need a choli, which looks sort of like a short-sleeved crop-top, and a “petticoat,” or straight ankle-length skirt often made in a fabric that matches the sari. The petticoat will serve in three capacities: to hold the pleats in place; to preserve modesty as a half-slip (some sari fabrics are quite sheer); and to make sure the sari drapes correctly. Make sure the waist of the petticoat fits fairly closely but still comfortably. It may be either elastic or tied shut. Many saris have a plain end, meant to be the hidden beginning end, and more ornate decoration on the rest of the cloth.

Wearing the petticoat and the choli, hold the top of the plain end of the sari cloth in front of you, with most of the fabric going toward the left. Toward the right of your navel, tuck a few inches of the top down and over the waistband. Gather some fabric in 3–5 neat pleats of equal width and then tuck the next bit of fabric top in at a point towards the left, though not as far as your left hip.

Wrap the fabric once around you going counterclockwise. Gather the remaining fabric and drape it over your left shoulder. The upper border of the sari should slant across the bust from under the right arm to over the left shoulder. The remaining fabric should be about a yard in length and fall evenly behind you. The bottom of the sari “skirt” should brush the top of your foot.

Sounds easy, right?

In fact, it will take some practice to make the pleats neatly so that they drape gracefully. The effect is well worth it: The sari is one of the most beautiful costumes, and quite flattering to the female figure.

If done correctly, the sari will not unwrap even during the longest day. If you are uncertain of your technique, however, it is easy to use safety pins to secure the garment.

A final note: There are those who say the choli is a relatively recent addition to the costume, and that this article was introduced by the British for modesty reasons. In some areas of India, women do not wear cholis with this style of sari dress. However, there’s plenty of art to support the choli as a traditional part of the sari dress, at least in some parts of India.



SCA Memories

Now, when I say she was older, you must understand that this is from the perspective of a 13 or 14 year old boy. Looking back, she was probably around 30, give or take a few years. So imagine the reaction when she proceeded to make much of me, saying how cute I was and asking if I “would like to come back vit her to ze northlands”. I don't recall running from the room, but I certainly wanted to.

The next most memorable moment is much more pleasant. Those who know me are probably aware that my wife and I have no children. This is not from choice or want of trying. It is just the way things have turned out, and we have come to accept it. So I take a special joy in watching the children of others in our barony grow up and blossom into fine men and women.

One day, I happened to be with a group of people sitting around Baroness Lissa at an event. Lissa is, of course, the reigning head of the Ansteorran Baby-Holder's Guild. As such, she had taken over Mistress Kaitlyn's daughter Alex, who was then only a few moths old. She looked over at me and asked if I would like to hold Alex for a while. So I did, and for a while I sat staring at that tiny, sleeping face as I rocked gently back and forth. The rest of the world did not exist for that little space. Thank you, Lissa and Alex, for one of the sweetest moments in my life.
